

"Progress Return - Transfer Cases"





May I be permitted to make a suggestion concerning the basis of diagnosis in cases of malignancy entered in the Hospital Cancer Statistics.

Would it be possible for you to revise your previous ruling so that histological diagnoses obtained by non-member hospitals or by medical practitioners may be accepted as satisfactory for our statistics.

It is not uncommon to find that we (the contributing hospitals) have no basis of any kind for our diagnosis unless we accept the previously obtained pathological report.

Patients are sent for deep x-ray therapy whose breasts have been removed. Strictly speaking we cannot even make a routine clinical diagnosis, no evidence of carcinoma is present.

I feel myself in a quandary about this question, as it seems a pity not to recognize the only pathological diagnosis which will be available. This is especially the case if the diagnosis has been made by the University or by a recognized hospital authority for the outside hospital or medical practitioner.

M May I quote a case?

No. 1381, Mrs. Florence Billington (F, 33, M with five children), Carcinoma of Breast, Left, entered in Register 18/4/41. A simple mastectomy was performed at Warrnambool. The specimen was sent to Professor MacCallum who reported Carcinoma. A radical mastectomy was then performed at Warrnambool and the patient subsequently sent for deep x-ray therapy to the Royal Melbourne Hospital. No method of diagnosis now presents itself.

To justify the entry we must quote the histological finding, the scar in itself, is not sufficient evidence.

I should be glad to have your opinion and ruling on this point which particularly affects hospitals doing much deep therapy work.

In view of the meeting of cancer registrars on Monday afternoon next, may I propound a few queries beforehand?

(C) Carcinoma of the skin not infrequently invades the deeper structures of the body, and in some instances may necessitate amputation of limb. Are we justified in retaining the original diagnosis?

What is your ruling on radio-necrosis? A case of malignancy treated originally by radium is readmitted with a radio-necrotic lesion, there is no evidence of recurrence. If this case is accepted for record purposes, what is the stage of disease? and what is the treatment to the malignant condition?

How would you classify deaths occurring from bronchopneumonia following upon a successful operation or amputation for removal of a malignancy? The death may occur a week or two after the operation.

I am not quite sure of your ruling on the question of two separate malignancies occurring in the same patient and being treated at the same time.

A point sometimes arises in cases of Carcinoma of the Lip regarding diagnosis. The original treatment may have been by means of Radium without a Biopsy - routine clinical diagnosis. Subsequently it may be found necessary to do an extemporised radical operation and surgically to remove cervical lymphglands suspected of being malignant. On examination histologically these are found not to show any signs of malignancy. Should this histological report of a negative character be quoted, and is the original diagnosis affected?

In completing the Supplementary Summary Sheet I have observed that in one respect there is a tendency to repetition.

Under the heading Basis of Diagnosis (operative) the nature of the operation is specified such as radical mastectomy, exploratory operation, etc. Under the heading Treatment (b) Specific Details, Technique, it is probable that the same specific operative detail will be repeated. When a malignant growth involves more than one structural organ such as tongue, tonsil and palate or stomach and oesophagus it may be very difficult to decide which is the original and more important lesion. Lesions are occasionally diagnosed as pre-epitheliomatous, should these be accepted?

Should cases operated upon at one member hospital, and sent to a second member hospital for a minor form of treatment such as deep therapy, be still followed up from the surgical aspect by the original hospital? or should the transfer be regarded as a permanent one?

I have looked over the list of patients transferred to the Austin Hospital from the Royal Melbourne Hospital during 1940 and not appearing among my cards for that year.

In the majority of cases these are patients who began treatment at the Royal Melbourne Hospital at a date considerably prior to the 1st January, 1940. In odd cases the diagnosis was not considered to be sufficiently definite to justify insertion in the register. A few others attended the Royal Melbourne Hospital for one day in transit to the Austin Hospital.

These were not admitted to the hospital and were not treated, it has been found difficult to check all applications for admission of cancer patients to the Austin Hospital, but some "tightening" up has been put into force.

Would you kindly give your
decision on the following somewhat knotty point
in the work of the hospital registrars?

It is not unusual to have re-
currences of malignancy admitted to hospital.
These recurrences may occur in the practice of
the surgeons or radio-theraputists of the in-
dividual hospital during a course of treatment
or soon after its completion. The difficulty
is to decide whether these cases should be entered
in the register.

A special type of case is that of
carcinoma of the lip treated six or twelve months
previously with radium or radon. Glandular en-
largements are observed in routine examination and
judged to be recurrences. Operative surgical
removal is decided upon and microscopic examination
shows no growth in glands. What should the entry
be in a case of that description?

It is also somewhat difficult to
place the carcinoma which is not the cause of
death, has not been observed during life, and is
only discovered post mortem in the course of a
routine examination. The assessment No. 7, heading
16, hardly fits the circumstances.
